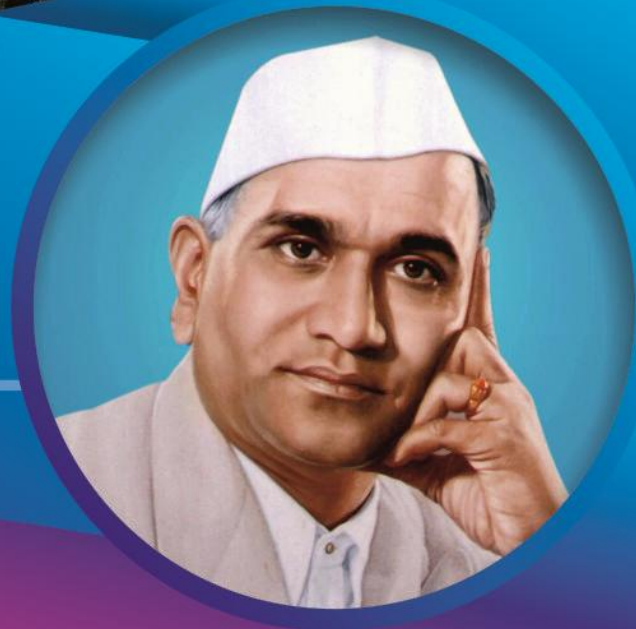

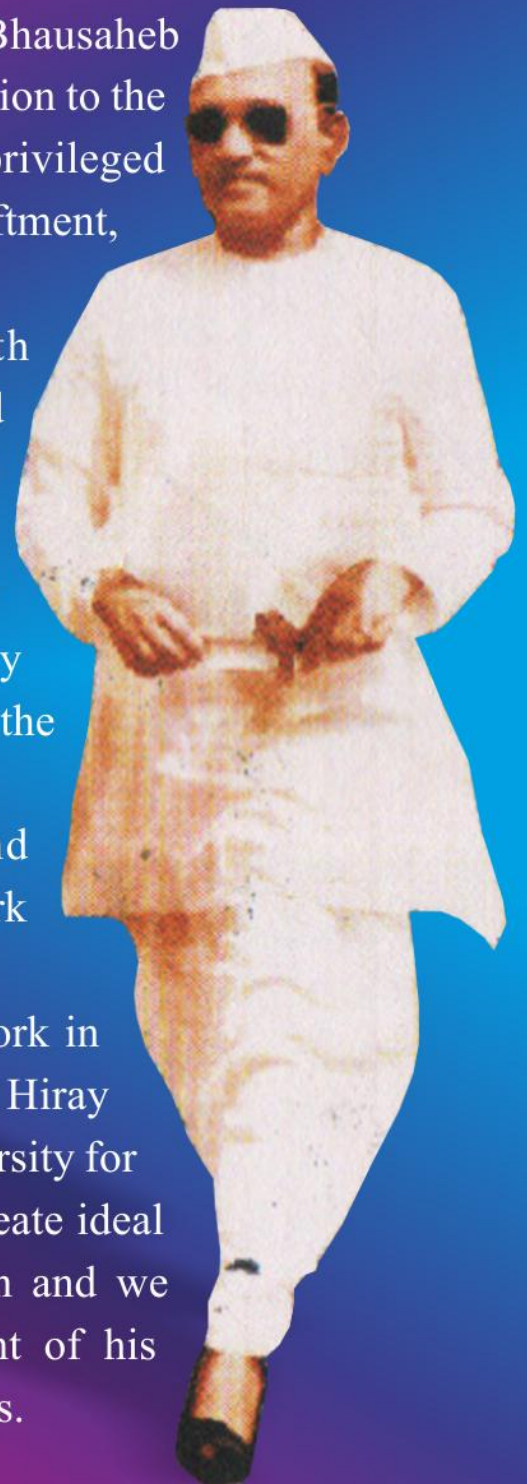

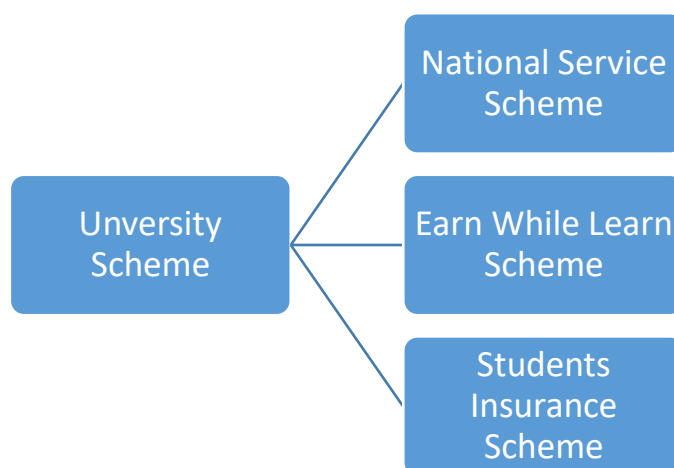

Some Special Features

As per the directive of the University all the First Year Students studying in the Colleges affiliated to the University of Pune have to undergo a medical check-up from the academic year 1979-80 onwards.

- a) The student failing to get himself/herself examined medically his/her eligibility will be cancelled.
- b) Those students who may not get themselves examined under this scheme, will not be permitted to appear for the University examination.
- c) Students will have to pay Rs.40/- as fees for medical check-up.

National Service Scheme

The University has sanctioned N.S.S. Unit to this College. The University has permitted us to enroll 250 students in this unit. The objective of NSS is to awaken sense of social responsibility among the youths of the country.

College Magazine

DISCIPLINE

Students shall abide by the general and special rules made by the College authorities from time to time in regard to their conduct and studies.

Students must put in minimum attendance (75%) in the College as prescribed by the University during each term. They must also carry out, to the complete satisfaction of the Principal, during the course of studies as prescribed by the college Authorities and the University. Every student shall be required to write two Tutorials per subject per annum.

Right of giving admission to a student is reserved by the authorities. Every student must get his/her I card attested by the Principal within fifteen days of admission. He/she must possess the card in the college premises and produce whenever it is asked for.

Students cannot organize themselves any visit tour or excursion without prior permission of Principal.

- Students must observe complete silence in the college premises.
- Students are strictly prohibited from eve Teasing and ragging
- Student's council will be formed by the principal as per the University Act 1994.
- Class attendance is compulsory Shahu Maharaj Scholarship concession will be withdrawn if attendance is less than 80%.
- Writing on the black boards, walls and anywhere in the college premises by the students is strictly prohibited. Chewing of tobacco, Gutkha, Pan Etc. Spiting, Smoking, Drinking intoxicants are strictly prohibited in the college premises.
- No students should accompany any outsider in the college premises.
- Copying in any type of examination is prohibited.
- Strict action shall be taken against students making any manipulation in any document. Students having any complaints should immediately report to the Principal.
- Discipline committee of the college shall take necessary action against the students if found guilty. Principal's decision is final and binding in all college matters.

Eligibility:

No candidate shall be admitted to the Third Semester examination of the second year unless he/ she has cleared first two semesters satisfactorily for the course at the college affiliated to this University.

T.Y.B.Com.

No candidate shall be admitted to the Third Year B.Com. (Fifth semester) Degree Course (2019 pattern) unless he/she has cleared all the papers of first and second semester Examination of F.Y. B.Com. And has satisfactorily kept terms for the second year (Third and Fourth Semester) and also fifth semester for the third year of B.Com) satisfactorily in a college affiliated to this University.

A.T.K.T. Rules:

- If a candidate fails in all the courses (subject heads) of passing of semester I shall be allowed to proceed semester II. However, a student who fails in four theory courses and two practical courses at semester I and II taken together may be admitted to semester III & IV.
- If a candidate fails in all the courses (subject heads) of passing of semester III shall be allowed to proceed to semester IV.
- If a candidate fails in all the courses (subject heads) of passing of semester V shall be allowed to proceed to semester VI. However, a student who fails in four theory courses and two practical courses at semester III and IV taken together may be admitted to semester V & VI.
- No candidate shall be allowed to proceed to semester V unless the candidate has cleared semester I & II in all courses (Subjects).

GUIDELINES FOR THE PAPERS TO BE OFFERED AT F. Y. B.Sc.

Introduction to Undergraduate Degree in Chemistry:

As per the recommendations of UGC and Savitribai Phule University guidelines, the undergraduate (UG) degree course in Chemistry is a 6-semester course for 3-academic years **OR** 8-semester course for 4-academic years. The Teaching-Learning Process (TLP) is student- centric. It involves theory, practical and also vocational and skill- based components. It offers flexibility in Programme structure and ensures a strong foundation and in-depth knowledge in subject. Besides the DSCs (Major Core), students have optional courses from the syllabus comprising of DSEs (Minor), VSCs, SECs, IKSs and OEs. Thus, it will facilitate the interdisciplinary as well as multidisciplinary approach within the curriculum framework. It will also allow students to have maximum flexibility in pursuing studies at UG level to the extent of having the freedom to eventually design the degree with multiple exit options. Students will have these exit options depending upon the needs and aspirations in terms of his/her career goals. This will suit the present-day needs of students in terms of securing their paths toward higher studies or employment.

Program Duration and Exit Options:

The duration of the UG Program is 4 years or 8 semesters. Students who desire to undergo a 3year UG Program will be allowed to exit after completion of the 3rd year. If a student wants to leave after the completion of the first or second year, the student will be given a UG Certificate or UG Diploma, respectively, provided they secure the prescribed number of credits. Students who exit with a UG certificate or UG diploma are permitted to re-enter within three years and complete the degree Program. The minimum credit to be earned by a student per semester is 18 and the maximum 26 respectively. However, students are advised to earn 22-credits per semester.

This provision is meant to provide students the comfort of the flexibility of semester-wise academic load. However, the mandatory numbers of credits which have to be secured for the award of Undergraduate Certificate/Undergraduate Diploma/Bachelor Degree in Chemistry are listed in **Table 1**.

2024 - 25

□ Program Duration and Exit Options:

- The UG Program is of four years divided in eight semesters. Student may leave the program after third year if, they prefer to receive a three year graduate degree.
- If the student decides to exit after first year, they will receive a UG Certificate, if they decide to exit after Second year; they will receive a UG Diploma. This will also depend on the total required credits they had earned.
- Re-entry within three years to finish the degree program is allowed for those who had left with a UG Certificate or UG Diploma.

A student must earn minimum 22 credits and a maximum 26 credits in each semester.

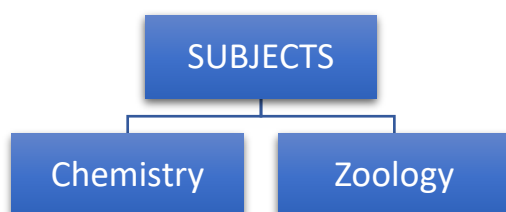

1. Duration:

The M.Com. Course will be of Two Years duration consisting of two part. I.e. Part I and Part II. Each part consists of two semesters. Thus, the M.Com. Course is of Four Semesters. For each Semester, there will be 22 credits. Total credits are 88.

2. Eligibility:

The student who has passed any Bachelors degree of this University or any other recognized University shall be held eligible to be admitted to M.Com. Course.

3. Course Structure:

The M.Com. Degree course will be of two-year duration consisting of four semesters and of 88 credits as below:

4. Exit Options:

After completion of the first two semesters (44 credits) of specified courses of those two semesters (i.e. 1st and 2nd) an exit option is provided to learners, at their specific request only, resulting in award of Post Graduate Diploma in Commerce.

5. Examination: -

A. A student cannot appear for semester end examination unless he/she has maintained 75% attendance during the teaching period of that course.

If a student fails to maintain attendance up to 75%, at the time of filling of examination forms, an undertaking from the student should be taken stating that he/she will be allowed to appear for examination subject to fulfilment of required attendance criteria during the remaining period of teaching of the course.

B. Each credit will be evaluated for 25 marks.

C. Each course will have a distribution of 40:60 for CIE and SEE.

D. To pass a course, the student has to obtain forty percent marks in the CIE and SEE separately.

E. If a student misses CIE examination, he/she will have a second chance with the permission of the teacher concerned. Such a second chance shall not be the right of the student; it will be the discretion of the teacher concerned to give or not to give second chance to a student to appear for internal assessment.

F. A student cannot register for the third semester, if he/she fails to complete 50% credits of the total credits expected to be ordinarily completed within two semesters. In this case, a student can seek

admission to first or second semester in order to complete the requisite number of credits and to be able to seek admission in the third semester. He or she will have to score 22 credits out of total 44 credits to be able to seek admission in the third semester.

G. There shall be revaluation of the answer scripts of semesterend examination but not of internal assessment papers as per Ordinance no 134 A and B.

6. Format for CIE : -

1. CIE will be of 40% of the total marks for the particular course. Following methodology be followed to conduct CIE:-

The subject teacher needs to adopt any two of the following methods for internal assessment:

- a) Written examination
- b) Online Quiz
- c) Power Point Presentations
- d) Projects
- e) Assignments

The INFIBNET facility is available under NLIST programme an access to 6,000+ E-journals and 1,99,500 + E-Books is made available to readers. This facility is being provided to research scholars, students and academicians. Reading Room facility is available with individual study zones for the staff members. The users have an open access in library to browse and borrow the books and journals at their own.

A) General Rules of Library:

- Every students entering in the Library should pass his/her valid Identity Card. It should be produced as and when demanded by any of the library staff.
- Identity Card and issue card is non-Transferable.
- Students should handle the books or periodicals very carefully. Any attempt of damaging the books of periodicals (defecting or tearing the page) will be treated as misconduct and shall be subjected for penalty.
- If the original Identity Card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued on the payment of Rs.50/- each.
- Two book at a time will be issued against the Issue Card. A student is allowed to keep the books for 7 days only. In case failure to return of the books in time, the students will be fined for daily as per the rules of the College.
- Issuing of books will be between 9.00 am to 5.00 pm with an interval of one hour from 1.30pm to 2.30pm

B) Special Library Facilities for students appearing for NET/SET and other Competitive Exam is offered.

PREVENTION OF RAGGING

Ragging is an offence as per
Maharashtra Circular No 170 of 2009 & UGC Guidelines,
Circular No.F1-16/2007 (CCPII) dated 17 June 2009. Prohibition
of Ragging Act 199. Any students found involving himself of
her self shall be dismissed with immediate effect action on the
accused students will be taken as per
Savitribai Phule Pune University.

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

1. Any conduct by the students or students whether, by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other students.
2. Indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any students or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance. Hardship, Physical or Psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or her any other student;
3. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche or such fresher or any other student.
4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular.
5. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or group of students.
6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
7. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of its sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
8. Any act or abuse by spoken words, e-mails, post, public which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
9. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over fresher or any other students.
